To his Excellency the Right Honourable Guy Lord Dorchester Carleton, Captain General, Governor, and Commander in Chief of Quebec, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick and their dependencies etc etc

The memorial of Samson Striker, late Sergeant in Colonel Delaney's Corps humbly sheweth that your Lordship's Memorialist being by their Majesty's instructions entitled to four hundred acres for himself and family, consisting of a wife and three children, has received only two hundred acres as yet. Humbly prays that the remaining two hundred acres together with his Lordship's Bounty of two hundred acres, in all four hundred acres, may be assigned to him in the Sixth Township. And your Memorialist as in duty bound will ever pray.
